After taking their romance public ("I was so nervous to tell my boss," John says), the couple was engaged in May 2005 on a surprise trip to Maui planned by John. "I definitely didn't think it was going to happen. in Rochester Hills. "We knew we wanted to be outdoors," John says. "And the people at Meadow Brook were so cooperative and excited to work with us."

With the help of a Dixie band, John and Michelle led guests in a parade from the cocktail reception at the front of the mansion to the tent in the back. The Italian-inspired menu included stuffed filet and Tuscan vegetables as a main course. The elegant evening was accented by the newlyweds' monogram on everything from the cake to the cocktail napkins to the dance floor.

"I always wanted to live a fairytale for one day," Michelle says. "I was not a sophisticated bride. I was a little girl living her dream."

Invitations: White with a silver border, completed with their monogram, by Crane's, from Saks Fifth Avenue, Troy

Cake: A customized cake that matched the lace on Michelle's veil, by Couture Cakes, Shelby Township

Wedding Planner: Carolyn Hefner, owner of the China Closet,



Birmingham. "We put her through the mill, but she kept the whole thing together," recalls John.

Hair: Luigi Bruni Salon, Birmingham. "He was so creative," Michelle says.
